Did you know that the oldest standing Synagogue in Georgia at 525 Telfair St. downtown Augusta is the original home of Augusta's Congregation Children of Israel, built in 1869? Nathan Jolles and Robyn Wittenberg Dudley, who are helping to create the Augusta Jewish Museum, have been long time members of CCI as well as their forefathers. Learn how in 2015, CCI Congregant Jack Steinberg OBM rallied the community to help save this beautiful, monumental synagogue and the adjacent historic Court of Ordinary, to become the Augusta Jewish Museum, a regional center for education and understanding.

Preservation is so important, and we want you to know this rich, meaningful history which makes the 175th CCI anniversary celebration even sweeter!

In the early 1950s, the congregation moved to its current home on Walton Way. Many legendary locals paved the way for the vibrant congregation that Rabbi Shai leads today. It is our honor to tell you these stories and to present the four pillars of education: Jewish Contributions to the CSRA, Jewish Life and Traditions, Remembering the Holocaust, and Israel the land and the people.
